eHLbc All Member Meeting



Every few years, the eHLbc consortium has hosted an in-person All Member Meeting for all members. This year's meeting took place on November 15, 2019 at the Hyatt Regency in Downtown Vancouver. Members of the eHLbc community connected and collaborated across the health and post-secondary sectors throughout the day.

After a warm welcome from Mary Anne Guenther on behalf of the eHLbc Management Committee, Anita Cocchia led an ice breaker activity, where members discussed words that were identified as key shared values and how they relate to the eHLbc community.

Following the ice breaker, Leah Hopton of the BC Electronic Library Network led a Governance Review discussion. Starting with a history of how eHLbc's governance structure was set up, the group explored potential adjustments so that the structure continues to fit the organization today. One adjustment was the name change from Steering Committee to the All Member Group from this point forward. Ideas and thoughts shared at the meeting will be brought forward to the Management Committee for further discussion and further action.

After lunch, Sunni Nishimura of the eHLbc Admin Centre provided a Strategic Actions Update of what the consortium has accomplished since the previous meeting, and what projects are currently underway. Progress reports are available on the eHLbc website, and can be accessed <u>here</u>.

In the afternoon, Megan Robertson of the BC Electronic Library Network facilitated a Knowledge Sharing Marketplace activity where each table brainstormed the top superpowers that they possessed, and which might be areas of focus for future knowledge sharing meetings. This activity was a big hit amongst members and was a great opportunity for eHLbc members to collaborate and learn from one another via a unique, interactive exercise.

Elsevier's Clinical Skills licence - 5-year extension approved!

The eHLbc licensing team is pleased to announce that the current Health Authority Clinical Skills contract has been extended for an additional five years (2021-2025), at a low

This extension means that students and health care professionals will have ongoing access to this essential clinical resource as they deliver expert patient care. For health authorities, it means they can continue to expect the same predictable pricing increases.

Pricing is now available for EBSCO's Dynamed product. On August 21, 2019, a new version of Dynamed was released with some added content/functionality, including:

- Single Sign-On (SSO) integration with Cerner
