

e-HLbc 2017 Ranking Survey

Member institutions are invited to submit ONE completed Ranking Survey no later than **July 7, 2017**. To prevent colleagues from overwriting each other's responses, please consider assigning a delegate to complete the survey on behalf of your institution.

Survey Overview

Each institution is asked to choose its top 5 products from the list of products compiled through the e-HLbc e-Box and evaluate each one on a scale of 1 (highest priority) to 5 (lowest priority). Based on the aggregated results, approximately two or three products will be chosen for consideration for consortial licensing. Members are also asked to indicate for all products listed in the survey a) which products they already license, and b) how likely they would be to license each product should a consortial license be made available (i.e. does your institution have the funds and the intent to license consortially in the next few years). Indicating a high interest in licensing a product does not commit your institution to join a group license at this time or in the future.

Deadline

You may complete the survey in one pass or over several successive login sessions before the closing date of **July 7th**. e-HLbc will consolidate and post the results of the survey, along with a plan for follow-up actions.
