



## What is e-HLbc?

e-HLbc is a consortium that was formed to provide province-wide access to selected e-resources, such as databases, abstracts, and full-text journals.

The vision of e-HLbc is to provide the entire BC academic and health care community with province-wide, consistent, high quality, cost-effective, equitable, and easily accessible health library resources that will support and improve practice, education, and research.

Membership in the consortium is comprised of 6 health authorities, 24 post-secondary institutions, 2 provincial ministries, and the College of Physicians and Surgeons of BC.

The **Target Audience** for these resources are: health professionals, educators, researchers, and students working and/or studying in all healthcare fields and related disciplines, such as medicine, nursing, allied health, mental health, extended care, community care, social work, psychology, psychiatry, public health, community health, business, administration, and law.

## OVID Databases

### EBM Reviews

A definitive resource for EBM that combines 4 of the most trusted EBM e-resources into a single database. **Full-text access is available for the Cochrane Database of Systematic Reviews, and ACP Journal Club.** Abstracts and Indexing are provided for the Database of Abstracts of Reviews of Effects (DARE), and the Cochrane Central Register of Controlled Trials (CENTRAL).

### MEDLINE

**Subject Coverage:** medicine, nursing, veterinary medicine, the healthcare system, dentistry, pre-clinical sciences and much more! Includes OldMEDLINE (1950-1965).

**Content:** Contains over 13 million citations. Indexes 4,600+ current biomedical journals in over 30 languages. Journal coverage goes back to 1950.

## OVID Full-text Journals

### LWW Total Access Collection

**Subject Coverage:** medicine, nursing, and bioscience

**Content:** full-text access to over 200 journals, many of which are on the Brandon-Hill selected list. Access to TOC's and bibliographic citations for the entire Journals@OVID collection.

## EBSCO Indexed Databases

### CINAHL with Full-text

**Subject Coverage:** Covers all aspects of nursing, allied health, consumer health, patient education information, and more!

**Content:** Indexes 1,000+ nursing and allied health journals; **full text access is available for 300+ titles.** Also indexes some books/book chapters, standards of practice, and more!

### MEDLINE

The **Subject Coverage** and **Content** will be the same as listed under OVID MEDLINE. The 2 editions differ in terms of the search interfaces offered by fOVID and EBSCO. Indexed journal coverage goes back to 1950.

## PsycINFO

**Subject Coverage:** psychology, psychiatry, and related fields/specialties such as, medicine, pharmacology, sociology, education, nursing, law, and more!

**Content:** Indexes approx. 2,000 journals. Contains nearly 2 million citations and summaries of: journal articles, book chapters, technical reports and more! Indexed journal coverage goes back to 1887.

## EBSCO Full-text databases

### Biomedical Reference

#### Collection: Comprehensive

**Subject Coverage:** clinical medicine, dentistry, the pre-clinical sciences, and more.

**Content:** Access to approx. 900 full-text journals indexed in *MEDLINE*. 850 of these titles are peer-reviewed publications.

Full-text Journal coverage goes back to 1960.

### PsycARTICLES

**Subject Coverage:** general psychology and specialized, basic, applied, clinical and theoretical research psychology, as well as psychiatry.

**Content:** full-text access to 56 journals, and 44,000 articles in PDF and HTML formants. Updated daily. Full-text Journal coverage goes back to 1985.
