Directions and Goals

eHLbc's 2024-28 Strategic Framework offers a flexible planning approach for the future, mobilized by four core directions. The consortium adopts shorter cycles (2-3 years) to establish goals, facilitating frequent evaluation and necessary adjustments to ensure progress meets members' needs.

1. Support eHLbc Members

2-3 Year Goals:

- Ensure eHLbc's administration and operations are in alignment with BC's Accessibility standards.
- Strengthen orientation materials and processes, including the development of an asynchronous orientation program.
- Identify areas of common interest to members and preferred methods of connection to support communities of practice.

2. Optimize Professional Development

2-3 Year Goals:

• Facilitate member-to-member learning opportunities, driven by needs assessment.

3. Grow Collection of Opt-In Resources

2-3 Year Goals:

- Review the eHLbc Electronic Suggestion Box (eBox) and Ranking Survey processes to ensure the consortium is pursuing appropriate resources.
- Ensure eHLbc Model License reflects evolving BC Accessibility standards and remains aligned with eHl bc values.

4. Maintain a Core Suite of Resources

2-3 Year Goals:

- Align terms and conditions for Core Suite vendors with those in the eHLbc <u>model license</u>, ensuring they reflect eHLbc values and BC Accessibility standards.
- Increase awareness of the content and scope of eHLbc's core resource suite.
- Engage in an ongoing review and analysis of core suite content for relevance.

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
