Since its launch in 2006, the Electronic Health Library of British Columbia (eHLbc) has rapidly become one of Canada's most successful health consortia, with an innovative approach to providing province-wide, equitable access to evidence-based information for health students and practitioners in BC and Yukon.

eHLbc membership has grown from an initial 33 to 50 members today, representing the health, post-secondary, and government sectors. eHLbc's offering of licensed resources has also expanded – from 7 to 26. Through commitment to this vital consortium, eHLbc members can provide their users – health practitioners, researchers, educators, and students – with critical access to a baseline collection of health information.


- Support for database troubleshooting, platform migrations, invoicing, and statistical analysis.

Membership Fees 2018 Renewal

Since 2006, eHLbc has contracted the BC Electronic Library Network (BC ELN) as its Administrative Centre to provide the necessary staffing and infrastructure for the consortium's operations.

eHLbc members pay a membership fee to cover Administrative Centre costs such as staffing, hosting fees, meetings and teleconferences, newsletters and reports, clerical and technical support, website maintenance, and strategic planning. The fee is based on the cost of 1.5 FTE for the eHLbc Manager and additional staff support.

The Management Committee endorses the membership fee, outlined in the Membership Pledge, which is then affirmed by members for the period of the Core Suite renewal.

Full and Affiliate Member fees are priced in Canadian dollars.

Full Members	Full Member fees cover the base operational and administration costs of the consortium. Full Members commit to annual membership fees over a four-year period.
Affiliate Members	Affiliate Member fees cover the special projects and extraordinary expenses of the consortium. Affiliate Members commit to membership fees on an annual basis.

For the 2018-2022 membership renewal:

- 1. eHLbc has moved to a four-year Membership Pledge, based on the four-year Core Suite commitment.
- 2. There will be a modest stepped increase to the membership fees to cover Administrative Centre staff salary increases primarily resulting from the negotiation of a new collective agreement at Simon Fraser University, the host site of the eHLbc Administrative Centre.

Membership Fees for 2018 Renewal



Full Member Fees

Member fees cover Administrative Centre costs, which are split evenly between the Post-Secondary and Health sectors. At the 2012 membership renewal, fees were not increased. With this renewal, to meet rising staff costs there is a stepped increase of:

5% in 2018-19 4% in 2019-20 3% in 2020-21 2% in 2021-22

These modest annual increases shield members from a more impactful single, large increase.




Post-Secondary Sector

Post-Secondary Member fees are calculated at approximately \$0.31 per FTE, within a minimum of \$650 and maximum of \$11,000.

Health Sector

The Health Sector division of costs is based on the BC Ministry of Health's allocation of the global health care budget. It additionally includes the Ministries of Health and of Children and Family Development, and the College of Physicians and Surgeons of BC, which pay the same amount as the smallest health authority.



Affiliate Member Fees

Affiliate Members renew their membership and commit to fees on an annual basis. Membership fees have not increased for the past three years. To cover rising staff costs, with this renewal there is a stepped fee increase (5% in 2018-19, 4% in 2019-20, 3% in 2020-21, 2% in 2021-22). These modest annual increases shield members from a more impactful single, large increase.

Affiliate membership fees will be calculated at approximately \$0.31 per FTE or headcount, within a minimum of \$650 and a maximum of \$1,000.

The FTE or headcount supplied by Affiliate Members prior to the Core Suite renewal on April 1, 2018 are used for the 2018-2022 license term.



As a result of PABC's eHLbc membership, every physiotherapist in BC has access to the same essential, evidence-based online health resources. Physiotherapists will continue to access the same core suite of resources throughout any career transition. This is an advantage that is not available to physiotherapists anywhere else in the country, and one that has PABC members proud to be up on evidence.
